Orientation and Research Methodology Workshop for 1st year postgraduates (2019-20 batch)

Date: 6th to 8th August 2019 Venue: Library seminar hall **Summary**

The Orientation program for 1st year postgraduates (2019-20 batch) started with an invocation song to invoke the blessings of almighty by Dr. Preeti and Dr. Mahima First year post graduate students from department of Anesthesiology. Dr Asha, Convener Student Research Committee welcomed the dignitaries to the program. This was followed by inauguration of the program by watering the plant by the Honorable Chancellor Dr. Kumar S, Principal and Dean Faculty of Medicine Dr PN Sreeramulu, Registrar of the Academy Dr. KNV Prasad, Director of Academics Dr Sarala N, PG Director Dr Mohan Kumar, Vice Principal Dr KN Shashidhar, Convener SRC, Dr Asha B, Program Coordinator Dr Jagadamba and two post graduate students.

The introductory remark was given by Dr. P. N. Sreeramulu, Principal, Sri Devaraj Urs Medical College, who sensitized the post graduates on the need for the orientation program. The honorable Chancellor Dr Kumar S delivered the presidential remark and welcomed the students to SDUAHER and mentioned that they are part of this Academy forever. He encouraged the post graduates to utilize the facility provided by the Academy for acquiring required competencies. The dignitaries, resource persons and participants introduced themselves during Ice breaking session

The first session was on Academic Requirements, where the PG students were enlightened about the Competency Based Medical Education in PG curriculum. The academic activities such as seminars, Journal club, CPCs and interdepartmental symposium were mentioned. They were informed regarding the logbook submission dates, check list for review of log books of pg students, assessments and eligibility criteria for university examination.

The second session was on Teaching Learning Methods who stressed upon traditional and work place based methods of teaching and learning. Edgar Dales cone of experience regarding passive and active learning was highlighted. Following this there was a session on Clinical (Bedside) Learning and Assessment which included various components of PG curriculum, clinical reasoning process, Evidence Based Practice and workplace based assessment.

Following a tea break, the session was on NABH documentation guidelines regarding importance on NABH documentation, case sheet entry and prescription writing. Next session was on Pharmacovigilance with focus on importance of reporting the Adverse Drug Reactions and drug safety. This was followed by NABL guidelines for investigations, sample collection, work flow in laboratory, requirements for laboratory testing and laboratory forms like test

request forms and consent forms. A very brief session by Dr. Gururaj Rao, Student councilor, who addressed the gathering and encouraged them to overcome stress, seek his assistance when required anytime of the day and provided his contact number.

The post graduates were then introduced to various library resources and services by the Senior Librarian. The next session following lunch, was on Medical Ethics, effective communication skills and Professionalism. Hippocratic Oath and Rights & privileges of a Registered medical practitioners were explained by quoting the case scenarios. The next session was on Medical Negligence, which briefed the common errors and manifestations of medical negligence with illustrations. Importance of Documentation was highlighted. Last session was on Consumer Protection Act and liability of doctors. The important court judgments for and against the doctors in various situations were quoted.

The day 2 was on Research methodology workshop which started with a brief report and feedback on day 1 by post graduate students. The first session was on Introduction of Objectives where the PG students were enlightened about the Research, thesis and synopsis. The synopsis outline was explained and stressed upon title that it should be short, clear and reflect the content. The second session was on Need for the study where the different components of need for the study including magnitude of the problem and gaps in knowledge needs to be emphasized. The next session was by on Review of literature where the participants were thought literature search by using PubMed search engine. The students were asked to create account in PubMed and demonstrated regarding the literature search by Boolean logic and Nesting to obtain relevant articles. Following a tea break, the session was on Research Questions, Research Hypothesis and framing objectives for research. A session on general principles of Ethics, Ethics Committee composition, conflict of interest, authorship criteria during publication and research misconduct was conducted. Following lunch, the students were divided into eight groups and two to three moderators were allotted for each group to discuss regarding the title of the study, introduction, review of literature and objectives. Later the students presented the modified synopsis in their respective groups. Feedback was collected.

The first session was on Methods and Materials – overview where the PG students were explained regarding importance of using appropriate methods and materials, defined the study population and duration of the study. The second session was on Study design, Sampling, Inclusion & Exclusion criteria where participants were explained regarding the different study designs and sampling techniques. Following a tea break, the session was about sample size calculation and various statistical tests that can be applied in the research. A session on writing the references was held where in the correct way of reference writing in Vancouver style was explained. The terms like referencing, bibliography, citations, secondary referencing and plagiarism were explained. The next session was on reference management tool followed by a session on grant chart.

Following lunch, the students were divided into eight groups and two to three moderators were allotted for each group to discuss regarding the methods and materials and referencing. Later the students presented the modified synopsis in their respective groups. Feedback was collected and the program was concluded.

Student Research Policy

Preamble:

Student as researchers exemplifies new attitudes and ways of working with young minds in a Medical college. It promotes a partnership between a teacher and the student where there is mobilization of knowledge mutually which enhances learning. Students, as researchers seek to involve, not merely using young people, viewing them not just as recipients or targets, but as resources and producers of knowledge.

Aims of the policy

- 1. Provide guidelines for the conductance, presentation and publication of research work
- 2. Provide essential infrastructure support for research work
- 3. Promote research and motivate the students

Guidelines

- 1. Motivated students to approach the guides for start of the research.
- 2. The students can carry out projects seeking internal funds or can apply for external funded projects
- 3. The projects denied of external funds can apply for SDUAHER grants to support the work.
- 4. The project should be submitted to Institutional Ethics Committee for approval through proper channel
- 5. The research conducted at Sri Devaraj Urs Academy of Higher Education and Research should be conducted as per the guidelines by UGC/ DSIR/ ICMR fulfilling other ethical/ legal requirements
- 6. The students should attend state, national and international undergraduate conferences and present their work in these conferences as either oral presentation or poster.
- 7. The research work by student should be presented by student preferably, in rare circumstances the faculty can present the work with no objection certificate by the student.
- 8. Travelling grants in the form of registration fee, TA and DA will be provided by the Academy on submitting the documents for proof of presentation along with ethical clearance for publication.
- 9. Students applying for external student funded projects (ICMR-STS) should be the first author and the guide to be second and corresponding author.

- 10. Authorship criteria should be strictly followed. The authors should contribute in conceiving and designing of the study, acquisition of data, analysis and interpretation and critical evaluation of intellectual content.
- 11. The order of authors must be directly proportional to the contribution towards the research work.
- 12. The incentive for publication will be provided as per Institutes Incentive Policy.


